#### How to enter the People-Friendly Streets Pupil Competition:

We would like you to plan a campaign to encourage people-friendly streets and explain why it is good to leave cars at home whenever possible.

- 1. Decide who you would like to target with your campaign materials e.g. pupils (pester power), parents, local residents, businesses, school staff.
- 2. Talk to a few of your target audience to help you plan your campaign by finding out:
  - what they like about strolling or cycling in quiet streets;
  - what they dislike about moving through busy roads;
  - about any advertisements or posters that they remember, and which persuaded them to try something new.
- 3. Use this information to think about the best way to encourage people to leave their cars at home and make streets more people-friendly including:
  - persuasive writing in a front-page article for your local newspaper or school newsletter;
  - draw an entertaining comic strip that can be included in a local paper, newsletter or website. It could even be a simple flip cartoon;
  - are you musical and good with words? Write a song or rap or poem that could be shared in assemblies;
  - use your artistic skills to draw a colourful poster that could be displayed in a local library, community centre or at school;
  - have you got an eye for fashion? Design a T-shirt with an eye-catching slogan (see template attached).
- 4. On your own or with a team of no more than five pupils, plan a campaign that includes at least three actions from the previous list.


